### **Dinner Money**

Please remember that Universal FREE school meals finishes at the end of Year 2 and free school meals for everyone is not available from Year 3 onwards. Universal FREE school meals are offered to all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children.

### **Remote Learning**

Mrs Trussell is going to experiment with some remote learning in Class 3-4T. She is going to deliver a lesson to her class from her dining room with teaching assistants supervising the class. Teaching assistants will also use a visualiser so Mrs Trussell can see the work the children are producing in the lesson. It's a government requirement that teachers can deliver lessons remotely so I'm delighted that we are making progress in this area.

### KS2 Assembly

I am still delivering pre-recorded assemblies to classes on different themes but it was particularly rewarding to be able to deliver a certificate assembly during the past week. Some more normality.

#### **Bubbles**

We have been able to maintain the integrity of all bubbles throughout the term so far – no mixing in lesson times, lunchtimes or playtimes. This is because all staff are working incredibly hard to keep everyone as safe as we can. I must praise teaching assistants who have adjusted their hours to be here from 8 and teachers who have added the role of kitchen / meal assistant to their Job description.

If you need to speak to your child's class teacher and this can not be done at the start or end of the school day (I know this is very difficult) ring me or email me and I'll get them to telephone you. Some parents / carers are already doing this and it really seems to be working very successfully. Sometimes I can sort an issue out – lost kit etc. and I'm always happy to do so.
