
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- Saturday January 9th

School Attendance during Lockdown 3

Thanks to everyone who has responded so responsibly during these challenging times. Families have clearly understood the need to stay at home unless a school place is essential – vulnerable children / children of critical workers etc. I was very surprised that all children in nursery classes were allowed to be in school. Our pupils-in-school percentages (not including the nursery children) has ranged from 14% on Tuesday to 17% on Friday.

From Monday the children in school can


- 1. Wear a school uniform to school and bring a PE kit with them.

- 1. Our timetabled system showing daily lessons and activities. Clicking on the lesson / activity starts the learning.
- 2. Google Classroom an exciting mix of live and pre-recorded lessons. We are getting over 40 children linked to some lessons- following the teaching, asking questions, answering questions, receiving feedback and getting told off. It's working wonderfully! Please be sure to read the paragraph below that describes how we may be able to help with hardware.
- 3. Facebook Daily stories, PE lessons, Meditations, Yoga and Assemblies returning next week.
- 4. Workpacks Workpacks for next week, (Week 17) were available from yesterday morning. Many were collected from the school office, some we delivered and there are a couple we will be delivering early on Monday morning. Please remember if you are using the worksheets at home and you need some guidance, phone Holland Moor on our designated mobile number 07539635522 and there will always be someone there to offer support. Children are welcome to call. During the first lockdown some children rang to read me their story or to get their maths answers checked etc. We are always happy to support home learning.
- 5. Facetime Class 2M are continuing with their live reading sessions. We are hoping to extend this offer to other classes too.

Remote Learning Policy / Remote Learning Devices

Last Saturday I mentioned that I had placed our new Remote Learning Policy document on the website. As part of the policy I need to send out a survey to parents and carers to find out how easily you are finding accessing remote learning and whether you have easy access to suitable equipment – laptops, ipads, mobile phones – those sort of things.
