
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- Saturday January 30th

Teacher Tapp and Parent Ping





Every day I answer three or four questions on the Teacher Tapp app. Thousands of other teachers do the same and then a couple of days later I get the results. This allows me to compare Holland Moor with schools across the country. I find out, for example, how the take up of home learning compares. There's a parent equivalent called Parent Ping. Similarly parents have two or three questions to answer each day. You don't have to write anything, just tick a box from some suggested answers. It's easy and if I can get 60 parents / carers taking part I get direct feedback and analysis. This would help me a lot. I love data!
