
# A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- Saturday November 13

# Remembrance Activities at Holland Moor



To honour Remembrance Day, children across years three and four learned about the important roles of animals in World War 1. They showed true empathy when they discovered the terrible plight many endured. The children read and listened to poems and songs about wartime and even choreographed a short dance. After finding out about the significance of poppies and why they are still symbolic today, the children created their own poppy, or a piece of art that showed bright poppies against a gloomy background. The children all thoroughly enjoyed their learning and many have completed their own research about the war to further their knowledge.

The children in years five and six took part in a range of lessons based on Remembrance. They looked at who, why and how we remember. They explored remembrance poetry and wrote their own poem on a poppy they had made. The classes gathered all the poppies to make a class wreath. The children

also created some beautiful pieces of silhouette artwork as well as learning about what happened to children during both WWI and WWII.
