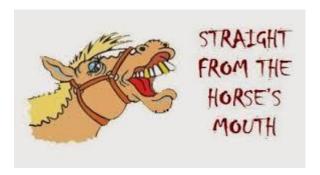
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- Saturday October 23
