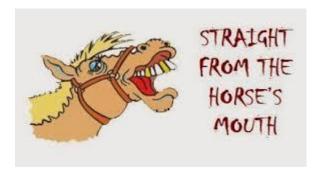
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- Saturday January 22
