
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- March 05 2022

World Book Day-Thursday March 03

BOOK DAY

The children in Nursery 2 and Nursery 3 listened to the story 'Soup Day' by Melissa Iwai. They followed the instructions in the book to make their very own soup. The children loved chopping, blending, heating and tasting their soup – some even took a sample home for their tea! The children described what was happening during each stage of the process and thought about which other vegetables they could use if they were to make the soup again.

World Book day for Year 1 and Year 2 was simply wonderful. The children were mesmerised by the story 'The Barnabus Project' and showed so much empathy towards the characters. They loved having their very own Barnabus in a jar to look after for the day.

Children in Year 3 and Year 4 enjoyed the activities based around 'The Journey' by Francesca Sanna. They discussed and explored the difficulties faced by refugees and role-played how it would feel to be crammed into a boat looking for safety. The children used a range of mediums to create contrasting art based on the illustrations in the book. During the day, the children were challenged to complete a writing task in ten minutes by Thomas Taylor, the author of our class novel, 'The Malamander.' They ended the day by joining Burnley Youth Theatre to listen to a reading of the book 'Six Dots' the story of Louis Braille

For World Book Day Year 5 and Year 6 focused on the book - The Journey by Francesca Sannathe children responded fantastically to the book and were able to use the illustrations to show a greater understanding of the text and the meanings behind different parts of the story and the images shown alongside. They were able to use this knowledge of the journey refugees take showing great empathy, to write three short diary extracts detailing the experiences refugees have when they are travelling. The children also used wonderful artistic skills when creating artwork based on the many birds shown throughout the book.

On Monday, the children in Year 5 and Year 6 watched a live stream from the Cambridge Theatre in London (the home of Matilda the musical) where different authors, and MC Grammar, discussed the importance of World Book Day and what they loved about books and writing stories. The children thoroughly enjoyed listening to the authors especially Humza Arshad who writes The Little Badman series; they were also treated to a performance from Matilda herself.
