
# A Weekend Update from Holland Moor- April 02 2022

### **Loop Games**



The children in year three and year four worked really hard developing their scientific knowledge and retrieval of previous learning using loop games this week. Each class was given a topic that they had previously studied in Science lessons and every child was asked to write a question and answer about it. Many children also wrote a further question and answer based on their own scientific knowledge. All questions and answers were checked by the teachers and made into a loop game. The games will be shared with other classes in KS2a after Easter to see who can complete the games in the quickest time. Similarly, the children in year five and year six have been retrieving their scientific knowledge, from their long-term memory this week through the introduction of a very challenging loop game; they made wonderful progress with one class managing to complete their game in just 2 minutes and 28 seconds - well done 5E!
