
A Weekend Update from Holland Moor-June 25 2022

Mr Beale's Highlight of the Week



I was delighted to be invited to our year five classes during the week. The classes showed wonderful cooperation during their paired-writes. The children were tasked with constructing an interview script between the character in a video named Artisan (a mystical inventor who brings mannequins to life) and an interviewer for a popular news channel. Working diligently in their pairs, the children wrote insightful and probing questions to pose to Artisan while responding with well thought out and deeply explained answers which contained informative subordinate clauses. The scripts contained stage actions that were coherent to the situation and each question. The children then performed their interviews to the class with one taking the role of Artisan and the other taking the interviewer; presenter voices, exceptional confidence and appropriate actions resulted in stunning deliveries from all the children. The smiles and sense of pride for each other's achievements was fantastic. A great display of skill from Year 5!

Year Group of the Week - This week it's Year 5



Class 5E and 5R started their new science topic with some excellent demonstrations of scientific skills and a clear understanding of key conceptual knowledge. The classes explored reproduction in plants through a dissection lesson where the reproductive system was identified; keen observations and precise working was evident throughout. This was followed up by a second lesson on reproduction, where stem cuttings were taken and planted to demonstrate how plants can reproduce from a single parent origin - the children are currently nurturing their plant clones in hopes of growing a new, identical plant. The classes then moved onto life cycles where the children used outstanding sketchnoting to show the life cycles of an insect and an amphibian. They used the visualiser in class to project their work onto the interactive board to present and explain each stage in the life cycle - the scientific vocabulary and detail included in these presentations was impressive. We certainly have some wonderful future scientists here at Holland Moor!

Accordingly I'm going to dedicate my Wednesday mornings to offering parents and carers the chance to accompany me on a school tour and let you see the school in action. World Music Day - June 21st - Years 1, 2, 3 and 4



Year 1 and Year 2 children went on a fabulous journey exploring music around the world! They visited, China, India, Brazil and Africa, learning how to sing songs and had a fantastic time using the djembe drums to create African rhythms.

To celebrate World Music Day, the children in year three and year four explored music from China, India and Brazil. They listened to traditional instruments and learnt songs in the national language - the Chinese greetings song was a massive hit! The children watched national dances and were enthralled by Brazilian carnivals, Chinese dragons and the Indian Bharatanatyam folk dance. All of the children participated fully and thoroughly enjoyed learning about music from other countries.

For World Music Day, the children in Year 5 and Year 6 sang a different song at the end of every lesson; this ranged from songs from The Greatest Showman Film, a look at songs through the ages, pupil's own requests as well as a look back over the school's previous songs of the month including 'By Your Side' and 'Syllable Smash'.
