#### **Our Special Science Assembly.**



Year 5 and 6 accessed a live assembly, over Microsoft Teams, where they joined STEM Ambassador Andrew from the National Physics Laboratory to learn the latest vocabulary to describe the smallest and biggest things in science and engineering. The internationally agreed prefixes to the world's

measurement system (SI units) were explained, ranging from the miniscule picometre to the gigantic megametre, along with applications in real life for these different measurement scales. Afterwards, the children heard from research scientists about how new words were invented to deal with the very big and very small - with the new four being: ronna, quetta, ronto and quecto. Did you know these scales are so extreme that the entire weight of Planet Earth is estimated at 1 ronnagram? It was great fun hearing about these important new advancements in STEM.
