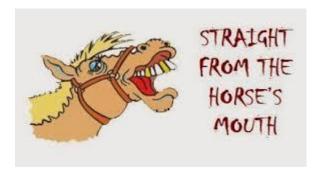
## A Weekend Update from Holland Moor-February 11 2023

#### **Safer Internet Day**



Safer Internet Day was a huge success. Our children watched a series of engaging videos with carefully planned activities to deepen their knowledge of how to use technology safely and respectfully.

Children in Key Stage 1 went on an online adventure with Captain Digi as he launched his ship and surfed the Internet! They used treasure from his chest to learn how to keep personal information secure, and how they can send a message in a bottle if they have any concerns about content or contact when using online technologies. Our Key Stage 2 pupils focused on gaming online and the effects of social media. They explored online bullying, age-related content, in-app purchasing, and the impact of excessive screen time. They also discussed the many and varied benefits of life in an Online World. All of the activities they took part in reinforced important and memorable messages about staying safe online.
