

Holland Moor Primary's innovative work scoops first Regional History in Schools prize

The award celebrates innovative work by teachers in north-west England in the fields of local and regional history, and was judged by a group from the Regional Heritage Centre's Advisory Board. The judges praised our submission for its wide range of material, including careful analysis of the historic landscape through maps. Our materials revealed little-known aspects of Skelmersdale's past prior to the establishment of the new town. Director of the Regional Heritage Centre Professor Fiona Edmonds said: "The resources submitted by Holland Moor Primary School were excellent examples of how regional and local history can be made interesting and accessible in schools.
