
# A Weekend Update from Holland Moor-March 04 2023

### World Book Day 2023-A brilliant Holland Moor event.



Nursery 2 celebrated World Book Day with the wonderful picture book Little Red by Bethan Woollvin, a fabulous take on the story of Little Red Riding Hood. The children drew pictures of Little Red and the wolf. They role-played the story using fabric sheets as improvised costumes, using their turn taking skills and made models of the wolf. Outside the children played the game – What's the time Mr Wolf! For snack, they, of course, ate the delicious cakes Little Red was delivering to Grandma's house.

Our Reception children also enjoyed reading 'Little Red' by Bethan Woollvin and were surprised to read that Little Red Riding Hood tricked the wolf. They spoke about alternative endings and discussed different versions of the story. Along with Little Red themed songs and yoga, the children created a wolf mask and in maths, measured the different objects that Red carried in her basket.

Year 1 and Year 2 activities were based on the story "Ten Delicious Teachers" by Ross Montgomery. The novel is about ten very foolish teachers that have missed the last bus home and decide to take a shortcut through the forest, unaware that there is a hungry horde of mischievous monsters waiting! The children created new front covers, maps for the teachers to follow and some children even wrote new versions of the story. On Friday the children enjoyed listening to one of our favourite stories "Would You Like a Banana" read live by the author and illustrator Yasmeen Ismail.

The stunning story, 'Paradise Sands' by Levi Pinfold was the focus of activities completed in Year three and Year four. The children competed several of their favourite TWR activities to gain a deeper understanding of the book. They demonstrated superb observation skills as they created their own landscapes in a similar style to the one from the book. The work produced was exquisite! Year 3 children joined an online workshop with Swapna Haddow and Sheena Dempsey and were given lots of tips for creating their own stories. Year 4 children participated in an online quiz, 'The Great Big Footy and Booky World Book Day Quiz,' hosted by footballing heroes.

Year five and Year six took part in a variety of activities for World Book Day. The Year 5 children welcomed Year one and Year two children to their classrooms for a book morning where the Year 5 children read a collection of their favourite books to them. During the read, the Year fives served them juice and biscuits. Afterwards, the Year five pupils enjoyed a well-earned hot chocolate and biscuit while they read their own books. Big smiles and a love for reading was shown throughout!

Also, the Year fives and Year sixes took part in the World Book Day Footy-Booky quiz online hosted by the Literacy Trust and the Premier League Primary Stars. Year five and six enjoyed being introduced to the book called The Viewer by Shaun Tan and, using the book as inspiration, produced some great writing and beautiful art work. Finally, the Year sixes took part in an online workshop hosted by Frank Cottrell Boyce who wrote the Unforgotten Coat -a book the children based a lot of writing on when they were in Year 5.
