
# A Weekend Update from Holland Moor-May 06 2023

## The Coronation of King Charles



## Our two-year-old class

This week the children enjoyed celebrating the King's Coronation. The children experienced a coronation picnic on Wednesday, and loved the cakes and listening to classic royal music. The children made shiny sparkly crowns, just like the King's crown. They were delighted to wear them during the picnic. The class coloured union jack flags and explored the colours red, white and blue! They even had red; white and blue play dough and made crowns out of the dough. During singing time, the class listened, followed actions to 'The Old Grand Duke of York', and marched like soldiers! Everyone loved the story 'Peppa meets the King' and the class have been building the king's castle out of a variety of different building blocks. Everyone had a fun filled week.

## Our three and four year old nursery class

Our nursery two class celebrated the coronation of King Charles 111 with great enthusiasm. They thoroughly enjoyed taking part in small world castle play, building castles and carefully placing royal dignitaries in important places. They loved making and decorating biscuits, to share with their parents at our special parent sharing celebration held both in the morning and the afternoon.

## Our reception classes

Our reception classes talked about King Charles III and even learnt some facts about his life. Did you know that he could fly a helicopter? They used a range of skills to prepare the food for their Coronation Party and sat together to enjoy sandwiches, biscuits and jelly and ice cream. Everyone made a 'nature' crown and decorated a royal plate.

## Year one and two

Children in Year 1 and Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed celebrating the King's Coronation. They learnt about the proceedings of the ceremony: its history, the stone of destiny and St Edward's Crown. They enacted some of the proceedings with the beautiful crowns they had made and then gathered in the afternoon to enjoy scones and a good old singsong. They all had such a great time. It is a day the children will certainly remember throughout their lives.

## Year three and four

Children in Year 3 and Year 4 took part in some rivetingly royal recreational activities! Each class was given a different royal coronation to research, then prepared presentations to participate in an assembly to highlight different monarchs from England's history. The children began their coronation activities with the design of their very own coronation garden – every one of them was fit for a king! They paid particular attention to the flowers ensuring their designs would incorporate the red, white and blue of the country's flag. The children helped plant a tree that they nicknamed 'Charlie' in

honour of our new king, to recognise the event and provide a reminder in the years to come about this historical occasion. Once the tree has established in the school grounds, the pupils will be involved in the design of a commemorative plaque for 'Charlie.' In preparation for their afternoon Coronation Picnic, each child made themselves a picnic, packing a sandwich, a crispy cake and some crisps into their parcels to enjoy with their friends. The picnic had to be moved to the hall (due to the weather) but this did not deter the children from having great fun and singing the coronation song with gusto.

#### Year five and six

Year 5 and Year 6 took part in a variety of activities to mark the coronation of King Charles III. The Year 5 pupils learnt about the upcoming event and then produced an information leaflet detailing what a coronation is, where it will take place and which items will be presented to the King during the ceremony. As well as this, the Year 5 classes took part in a coronation-themed sports event. All Year 5 and Year 6 pupils took part in a special assembly to mark the occasion. A group of children from each class presented a piece of work. Class 5E performed a poem about the coronation of Elizabeth I, Class 5R wowed the assembly with facts about Charles II, Class 5/6B perfectly performed a poem about Henry IV, Class 6M's poem about George IV was delivered beautifully and Class 6S rhymed their poem about Elizabeth 11 to perfection. In the afternoon, all classes had a tea party involving scones, jam, cream and selections of drinks!
